Representative Experience

- Lead defense counsel defending breach of fiduciary duty and other related claims brought by the United States Department of Labor against the company, the ESOP trustee, and a company board member. Following the filing of the Complaint in November 2017 and discovery and motion practice, the case was successfully resolved in 2019 by a Consent Judgment for less than 10% of the DOL's claimed amount of damages. *United States Department of Labor v. Big G Express, Inc., et al*, 4:17-cv-73 (E.D. Tenn. 2017-2019).
- Lead counsel defending national franchisor against claims brought by franchise group for breach of contract, breach of covenant of good faith and fair dealing, fraudulent inducement, constructive fraud, and negligent misrepresentation. The case was resolved and settled with minimal discovery and while the client's motion for summary judgment was still pending. Settlement entailed the dismissal of the litigation with prejudice and the payment by plaintiffs of a portion of client's attorney's fees. *Steaks of Virginia, LLC v. Steak N Shake Enterprises, Inc*, 1:18-cv-1048 (S.D. Ind. 2018-2019).
- Lead counsel prosecuting claims against departing president and new employer for breach of contract, tortious interference with contractual relationship, theft of trade secrets, and civil conspiracy (2016-2018).
- Lead counsel in the defense of a national accounting and forensic company against claims brought by a national public company for professional malpractice, negligence, breach of contract, fraud and deceit, constructive fraud, breach of fiduciary duty, aiding and abetting breach of fiduciary duty, civil conspiracy, and criminal deception (2016-2018).

Following extensive motion practice, discovery, and a two day mediation with multiple attendees, the lawsuit was resolved and subsequently approved by the court. *Kelly Jessop v. Dallin Larsen, Bankers Trust Company, et al*, 2:14-cv-916 (D. Utah 2014-2017), and *United States Department of Labor v Bankers Trust Company et al*, 2:16-cv-1159 (D. Utah 2016-2017).
- Lead counsel on successful defense of hotel franchisee against claims brought by national hotel franchisor seeking in excess of \$200,000 in franchise fees and attorney's fees in AAA arbitration. The arbitrator ruled the franchisor committed a prior material breach precluding all of the franchisor's claims against the franchisee (2015-2016).
- Lead counsel representing real estate developer successfully prosecuting claims against recalcitrant purchaser through summary judgment and appeal recovering over \$5 million in specific performance, interest, and attorney fees,

involving issues of breach of contract, anticipatory repudiation, laches, estoppel, and related claims *Metro Holdings One, LLC v. Flynn Creek Partners, Inc*, 25 N.E.3d 141 (Ind. Ct. App. 2014) (2013-2015).

Mr. Morrisson has also represented injured plaintiffs with such claims, including recovery in an Indiana state court jury trial of \$800,000.
